# FROM THE RABBI'S STUDY....

If Purim is past, can Pesach be far behind? No, even though Pesach is "late" this year.

Like everything else, it is rushing toward us with great speed. Perhaps the pace of events gives us a little sense of what the Israelites experienced when they were suddenly uprooted in the middle of the night and sent pell-mell into the desert to begin a forty-year journey! No time to pack, no time to prepare; just begin.

Some of us, it seems are always prepared; they live with a packed suitcase, "just in case..." And then there are "most of us," who are seldom if ever prepared for the unexpected. And some of us are never even prepared for the expected. As I draw closer to the date of retirement, I realize that to some extent I am in this latter category. Or am I? Many of the preparations that people have told me to make, I have made. But I feel like I have not. I feel like an anxious Israelite of the eve of the Exodus; something is going to happen; something is going to change!

We all know that the change the Israelites experienced was for the better. True, there were some difficult adjustments to make and not everything worked out the way we and God had hoped. But in order to survive, we had to change our way of thinking and our way of life. I know that I will have to make changes and that all of us will have to make adjustments.

It is traditional to make changes at Pesach. Nancy and I still change our dishes and pots and pans. We get rid of all the "chumetz" in the house. One of the lessons that Pesach teaches and reminds us about is the necessity for change. If we can make changes in the little things of life: in our diets and in our daily routine, then we can move on to the bigger and more important changes we all need to make from time-to-time.

Pesach, then, is not only a joyous celebration of national redemption and survival, but it is a paradigm for necessary change in life. May we all celebrate our ability to change with the times, to rejoice in the opportunity for personal and spiritual renewal, and the providential care of the God who makes it possible.

Nancy joins me in wishing you all a "chag kasher v'sameach," a joyous and happy Pesach from our house to yours.

# Judaica Shop

PRESIDENT

Elise Galinsky, of Judaica Gift Shop and Hanukah Happenings fame, has arranged with the Women's Exchange at 539 Orange Avenue in Sarasota a novel way for adding funds to Beth Israel Women's coffers. Under this arrangement discarded items, such as jewelry, small appliances or household items (not clothing) and even large items such as furniture can be donated to the Women's Exchange. If the item sells within 60 days, BIW will receive 65% of the sale price. If not, it is considered a donation. Donors may receive a tax deduction for a charitable contribution.

- 1) You must list your items and place a masking tape on each item with BIW's "consignment number," which is **58882**. The same procedure applies to large items except that photos must be submitted along with your list.
- 2) There is no central dropping off space at the Temple. You must personally deliver the item you are donating to the Women's Exchange and **must inform the Women's Exchange that the donation is for Beth Israel Women**.
- 3) If you have a large or heavy item to donate, such as furniture, arrangements can be made for a pickup for a minimum fee of \$70, depending on number and/or size, by a call to the Women's Exchange at 955-7859. You will be notified when the pick-up will take place.
- 4) Bring or call in your list to the Judaica Shop to receive a donation letter to attach to your list for your taxes.



# Men's Club


The Men's Club hosted a glorious Opera Night March 18 with the sanctuary filled to


